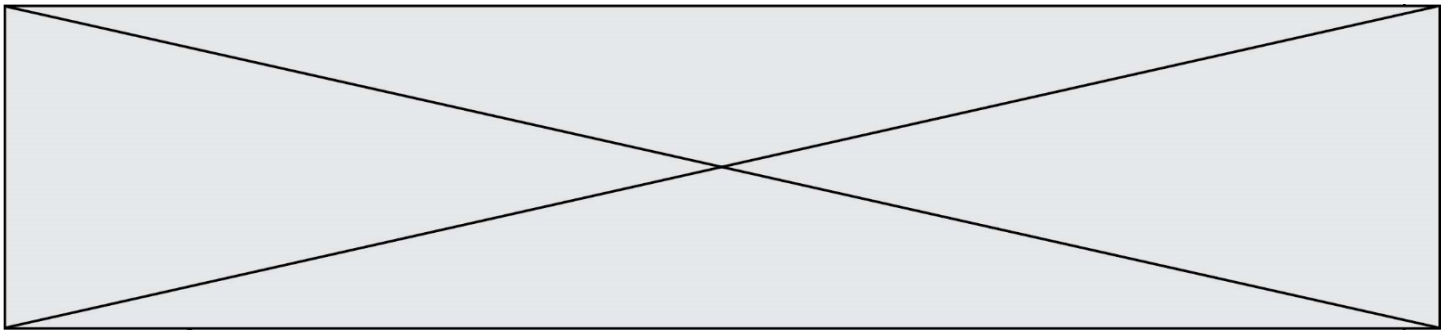
Text
